Twenty-seventh Sunday after Pentecost

Dear Friends,

As we prepare to cook our turkeys and eat our cornbread dressing next week, we are collectively thinking about the many blessings of this life for which we are thankful and for which we give particular thanks every year. For Christians, however, gratitude is not a one day a year feeling. We are called to be people of gratitude, to live gratefully, and to offer thanksgiving at all times and in all places. Living a life of gratitude can be hard, however, especially when complaining, grumbling, and judgmentalism become habitual. Here are some ideas to help you become a person of gratitude:

- Make a Gratitude List. Early on in sobriety and recovery, my sponsor encouraged me to regularly make a gratitude list. I was amazed when I experienced the incredible power and perspective provided by something as small and simple as writing down all of the things for which I am grateful. The more grateful I am, the more I write, and the more I write, the more grateful I become!
- **Prioritize thanksgiving in your prayers.** Prayer works because it changes us. Many of us turn to prayer in times of need or trouble, but how many of us pray when we are feeling grateful or when we want to feel grateful? Prayer can get us "unstuck" when our attitudes are not in alignment with God's will and praying prayers of gratitude can foster more gratitude in our hearts.
- Tell others you are thankful for them. Writing a gratitude list and praying to God keeps thankfulness private, but gratitude is meant to be shared. Writing thank you notes is good, but getting into the habit of expressing your gratitude for your family, friends, co-workers, and fellow church members is better. Make a commitment to thanking three people a day for a month and see how it changes you!

Friends, I want Good Shepherd to be known, both internally and externally, as a place of profound gratitude. The call in front of us is to develop an attitude of gratitude which moves beyond feeling and is instead embodied as we become a people who give thanks and encouragement at all times. I am grateful for each and every one of you!


MIDDLE SCHOOL PRAYER BREAKFAST
