The Third Sunday of Advent

Dear Friends,

During Rector's Forum last Sunday, we had a lively discussion about the meaning of Advent and the various ways and means we can welcome newcomers to Good Shepherd this holiday season (and beyond). In The Shepherd's Fold, we have discussed the idea to Invite 3, Bring 1 and I have encouraged parishioners to sit closer to the front of the church...but what do we do when someone new actually comes to church? I'm so glad you asked!

Here are three ideas for you:

- 1. Watch and greet. Keep an eye open for people you don't recognize and make a point of greeting them. This could happen before the service, during the Peace, after the service, or at all three points. One of the easiest ways to help a first time visitor become a second time worshipper is to interact with them. This will likely mean moving from your pew and walking across the aisle...
- 2. Introduce them to others. You do not have to be solely responsible for the maintenance and care of a first time visitor. That can be a time-consuming, pressure-laden task. Make sure to introduce other people to our visitors and make them feel even more welcome. Pro tip: Introducing a newcomer to your friends is an easy way to avoid awkwardness if you've forgotten their name...and it also makes them feel part of something bigger!
- 3. Follow-up and Invite. As you finish your conversation with a visitor, be sure to invite them to one of our other events. We have so many fantastic programs and ministry meetings during the week and it is our privilege to invite new people to participate. We aren't asking newcomers to sit at the kid's table for Thanksgiving, but rather we are putting a new leaf (or two) into the middle of our table and making space.

Why is this important? William Temple, Archbishop of Canterbury (1942-44), famously proclaimed "The Church is the only society that exists for the benefit of those who are not its members." As a parish we have so much to offer to those outside our walls and to those who are not yet our members, but we have to be intentional about inviting, welcoming, and connecting with our new worshippers as we hope to help them transition into new members.

THE POSADA


Joseph and Mary continue their journey this week and still need lodging **December 13, 14, and 17.** Call Jinny if you can make room for them.
