The Fourth Sunday of Advent

Dear Friends,

We have collectively entered the final stretch of Christmas preparations. Gathering the ingredients for Christmas meals, wrapping (or purchasing) the last few gifts, and making all of the arrangements before we celebrate the birth of our Savior. As Christians, we are not immune to the hustle and bustle of a world bathed in Christmas lights, jingles, and parties. But there's more to the story...

The Fourth Sunday of Advent is our final stop before we arrive in Bethlehem. On Sunday we are introduced to a young girl named Mary who is given the most magnificent news: she is going to bear the Christ child. This part of the story declares that the promises of God are finally coming true, the Lord has looked with favor upon his people and upon his servant, and God will dwell in flesh among us. We discover that God is with us, God is for us.

As we make those final preparations for next week and as we come to hear the story again and anew, may we remember that this magnificently good news of amazing grace is not just for us. This good news is a "joy to the world," a light in the darkness, a new hope in a weary and worried world. The most incredible gift we can ever give someone is the gift of the news that God loves them and that "unto us a Savior is born." Invite the people around you to hear that story at Good Shepherd on Sunday and Christmas Eve. We will also welcome the newcomer, connect with first time worshippers, and invite them to participate in our common life together, a life marked by the goodness and graciousness of God.
