The Second Sunday of Advent

Dear Friends,

Last week I encouraged you to **Invite 3**, **Bring 1.** I can confirm that one person pulled me aside to tell me that they brought someone to church with them! My intention with these Advent editions of *The Shepherd's Fold* is to highlight our opportunity to welcome visitors in our parish between now and Christmas Eve. Research shows that most first time visitors will decide within their first five minutes into their visit whether or not to come again. **This means we have five minutes to show them who we are.** No pressure!

Here is another example of what we can do to be more welcoming: try sitting in the pews at the front of the church. Yes, I know, that might mean moving out of the pew that your family has occupied for generations. It might even mean sitting near new people, but I'd like to explain with a story:

Brenda, a curious visitor, walks into the church just minutes before the 8:30 service one Sunday morning. Seeing that the back rows are already filled, our visitor has to sit where the open pews are: up front. Brenda hasn't been to church in years and feels a bit exposed, maybe even awkward, as she is sitting in front of so many strangers. She is unfamiliar with Episcopal liturgy and hopes she doesn't "mess anything up." Brenda would have preferred some anonymity in the back and the opportunity to watch and learn how Good Shepherd "does" Sunday morning. It gets especially lonely during the Peace when no one is close enough to greet her. Brenda feels she is on the outside looking in, unsure whether she will come back...

This is a fictional story, of course, but it is also a realistic composite. We need to view this as an exciting opportunity! There is an evangelistic imperative to show true hospitality in front of us: by moving forward during church we are creating space for first time visitors and young families, two groups of people who have no desire to disrupt the service or sit up front. We can show strangers and visitors the love of God and the warmth of our church by leaving the back pews open. Let's give each visitor a warm welcome at the door and a sense of ease when they walk into the Nave. Let's practice this together for the next three Sundays as we prepare for our Christmas Eve services. *And who knows...you might even find that God is present in every pew!*

THE BIBLE STORY BOOK SEARCH



THE LOST GOSPEL OF CHRISTMAS


Mark Swanson's original musical
