I had a lot of time to think. My reverie brought me back to those terrible pandemic days when for weeks millions were experiencing isolation and loneliness with many dying without their families with them.

Even though I was isolated, I never felt alone. Even through the long nights I never felt alone. The Spirit, my Advocate was there through all the many prayers I knew you were offering up for me. For that I am so grateful! I gave regular thanks to God that He put me at Good Shepherd for the last 50 years!

Somewhere along the way I had some sobering thoughts. I am well-known, upfront, your priest. We have known and loved each other through decades of friendship, so it is natural to have an outpouring of concern. But then what about our fellow members who are perhaps not so well-known? Members who may be isolated, alone or feel forgotten – what about them?

How about this for a New Years resolution? I am challenging myself to do this – perhaps you'll join me.

For the days, weeks, and months ahead all of us who are "regulars" pause and look around your pews to note who you haven't seen in a while. Then contact them and catch up – simple!

There should never be an isolated or lonely Christian. There must never be an isolated, lonely, or forgotten member of the Church of the Good Shepherd!
