THIN SPACES

Allison and I have just returned from a birthday trip to the North Carolina mountains. One of the things we like to do the most is simply to drive the mountain roads. Anyone who drives those roads will see many unusual signs: one of which is “Watch for Falling Rocks.” In all my years driving in the mountains, I have only encountered one significant rock on a highway, and it was not much bigger than a softball. However, the sign I never see, but which would be more useful would be “Slow down for Thin Spaces.”

Thin spaces are places of sacred power, where the separation between physical and spiritual worlds seems “thin.” They are places where God seems present in an almost palpable way. For me, the Blue Ridge Parkway is a thin space. As I look out on the grand scope of God’s creation, I sense God’s presence in a way that I rarely feel in my regular life. Thin spaces, however, are easily missed when we hurriedly go about our daily duties. On the Parkway, I need to slow down and take the time to stop at the overlooks in order to sense the “thinness” of the place.

In last week’s Shepherd’s Fold, Joe wrote about the need for us to take Sabbath time in order to “re-create” ourselves, a task particularly suited to the slower pace of summertime. As you slow down this summer, be sure to look for those thin spaces. You never know where they will be for you, but if you find one, you will have the blessing of an experience of God that only a thin space can give.
