Sixth Sunday after Pentecost

COME HOLY SPIRIT, COME!

Since the first of this year, I have renewed an old personal liturgical habit, which you will not find in the Book of Common Prayer. You may have noticed that when I am celebrant I have been starting the service not with the Acclamation, but with an invitation asking of you and myself to pause for a moment in silence, take a deep breath and breath in the Holy Spirit. After a few moments of silence and deep breathing the service begins.

I also do this little maneuver throughout each day to clear my head and heart of the noise of the world that has become our constant companion. I frequently add one or both of these mantras to my breathing, "Come Holy Spirit come," and "Be still and know that I am God." (Psalm 46:10).

The story of creation in Genesis 1:2 tells us "The earth was a formless void and darkness covered the deep, while a wind (breath) from God swept over the face of the waters." From the very beginning, God's breath was here! As the creation story goes on, we know that "God said, let there be a dome in the midst of the waters, and let it separate the waters from the waters, and God called the dome Sky."

This "sky" is our atmosphere. It gives us life and protects us from the cold vacuum of space. It is ancient air – all there ever was from day one. No new air is created – the old is just recycled. That deep breath you took a few moments ago is the same air breathed by all life that has gone before you and me.

Jesus breathed. When God became incarnate, in our flesh, he had a body; he had lungs, and had to breathe to live. On the cross, Jesus finally would breathe no more. In Mark 15:37 we read "With a loud cry, Jesus breathed his last." One last breath...

Actually, the way the story evolves, that was not his last breath. Barbara Brown Taylor offers this consideration. "When Jesus breathed his last

breath – willingly, for the love of us all – that breath hovered in the air and then it was set loose on earth. It grew, in strength, and in volume, until it was a mighty wind, which God sent spinning through an upper room on the day of Pentecost."

God's breath has been present since the moments of creation, is with us this very moment, and will be with us until heaven and earth meet.
