FOLLOW ME!

"Follow me!" Do you remember when Jesus said those words to you?

I know exactly when I heard those words! My mother, not afraid to speak for Jesus, put it this way, "Joe, I don't care if you have a stomach ache, you are going to church. Jesus is waiting for you!" Mother had a way with words.

My personal call(s) to follow Jesus came regularly over the years through my parents who were born and raised in Georgia in the first third of the 20th century. In that era in rural Georgia, if you were a southerner then by definition you were a churchgoer. If the church doors were open, my parents were there – I was there.

I will never be able to thank them enough for that!

We are all quite familiar with these words, "Follow me." Jesus says those words thirteen times throughout all the Gospels, and he says the words to all sorts of different folks.

These two words have had a lot of attention over the course of the last two thousand years. The timeless question is, "exactly what did Jesus mean when he said, "Follow me?" What do these mean for us individually?

Some think that "Follow me" is an invitation. I believe these words are an imperative command that requires the hearer to make a clear choice, yes or no.

For me being a follower of Jesus Christ is to be one who attends to the needs of others just as Jesus did. Followers of Jesus are ministers of the Gospel. When Jesus sent the twelve into the world, his instructions were simple. He told them to preach the kingdom of God and to heal (Luke 9:2). To do this in the name of Jesus is to be a minister.
